

## **DISMISSAL INFORMATION**

Some offenses may require a scheduling of a court date so that the prosecutor may review your proof.

You may request dismissal of your citation if you are charged with the following offense(s):

### **Expired Driver's License**

If you meet the following:

- Renew/Correct before your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation
- Present the receipt along with a \$20.00 dismissal fee

### **Driver License Fail to Display**

If you meet the following:

- Provide proof of driver's license before your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation.
- Present the original DL along with \$20.00 dismissal fee

### **Defective Equipment**

If you meet the following:

- Correct the equipment before your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation.
- Present the vehicle for verification and pay a \$10.00 dismissal fee
- You may appear at the court office and IF an officer is available to inspect vehicle. If no officer is available you may either return to the office at a later time or you MUST appear at your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation.

(For security reasons, clerks will NOT inspect defective equipment corrections.)

### **Expired Motor Vehicle Inspection (MVI)**

If you meet the following:

- The inspection certificate has not been expired for more than 60 days
- Renew your inspection before your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation
- Provide a legible receipt/emissions paperwork that identifies the vehicle inspected and date inspected
- Present the receipt along with a \$20.00 dismissal fee

### **Expired Motor Vehicle Registration (MVR)**

If you meet the following:

- Renew you registration before your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation
- Provide a legible receipt that identifies the vehicle registered and the payment of the required penalty fee to your County tax office
- Present the receipt along with a \$20.00 dismissal fee

**Insurance (Fail to maintain financial responsibility)**

You must submit proof before your appearance date listed at the bottom of your citation

Accepted proof:

- A valid policy of vehicle liability insurance before the date of the offense
- Must also possess a valid driver license
- Information provided on the policy Identification Card must contain
  - Name, address and telephone number of the insured
  - Name, address and telephone number of the insurance company (insurer)
  - Policy number
  - Effective and expiration dates of the policy

If these conditions are met then the offense can be dismissed at no charge.

Be advised that few, if any, insurance companies will assume liability if an unlicensed driver is operating the vehicle. Therefore, unlicensed drivers are almost always EXCLUDED in an insurance policy.
